The two primary first responders to a victim of human trafficking are law enforcement and Waymakers. Waymakers is a nonprofit resource helping people find their way. Whether redirecting youth offenders, helping sheltered children get back on track, unifying troubled families, resolving community conflicts or empowering victims of violence, Waymakers clears the path so clients can advance beyond crisis. When a Waymakers Advocate receives a call, they immediately go to assist the victim. They bring a bag including various necessities to meet the victim wherever he or she is. The victim's clothing may be taken for evidence or they may have barely any clothing on at all. Oftentimes they need the necessities of life, like shelter, food and toiletries. Your donation will go directly to these victims.

Collecting donations for the Necessities Drive until November 21, 2019. Drop off donations at OCBA headquarters. All clothing items and shoes must be new with sales tags intact.

Here is a list of the most needed items:

- Backpacks or small duffel bags
- Gift Cards, preferably Uber, Walmart and Ross
- Sunscreen
- Band aids
- Bug/mosquito repellent
- Full-size deodorants
- Flush-able sanitary wipes

- Reusable grocery bags
- Flats or flip-flops, sizes 6-8
- Dry shampoo
- Full size shampoos and full size conditioners
- Facial wipes
- Makeup remover
