Hello TMBA family,

Today's message will be short and sweet. Vote! "Slavery is not abolished until the Black man [and woman] has the ballot." These words, declared by the great Frederick Douglass, one month after the end of the Civil War, still ring true today. The only way that we secure true freedom and self-determination is by exercising our right to vote. Many brave and impassioned Americans protested, marched, were arrested, and even died working towards voting equality. Voting resulted in the passage of the 13th, 14th, 15th, 19th, and 24th amendments. Voting is also responsible for the Civil Rights Act & The Voting Rights Act. Voting has been responsible for dismantling local laws created to suppress the black vote. Unfortunately, voting has also been

responsible for creating local laws to suppress the black vote. Although the fight to protect African American suffrage still rages on today—These key pieces of legislation were critical in securing the right to vote for black men and women in this country. We owe it to our ancestors, our future generation, and the individuals on the front lines today, to exercise our right to vote!





RECAP OF TMBA'S PAST ACTIVITIES














THE ROAD TO BECOMING A LAWYER SERIES

In keeping with its mission, **TMBA** reaches out to various colleges and community colleges in the southern California area to provide pre-law students an opportunity to learn about the practice of law and law school life, all in an effort to encourage young African Americans to pursue a career in the legal field. Here is a recap of Part I and Part II of the three-part series, "The Road to Becoming a Lawyer," to educate pre-law students on various facets of the legal profession.

Part I: The Journey to Practicing Law - Firsthand Experiences from Black Professionals

Held on September 25th, students were exposed to seasoned attorneys across different practice areas. The webinar covered various aspects of practicing law as in-house counsel, civil litigator, and criminal defense and featured the following panelists:
