COURT OFFERS MCLE BENCH CONDUCT AND DEMEANOR TRAINING FOR TEMPORARY JUDGES

The Los Angeles Superior Court Temporary Judge Program is offering training for temporary judges pursuant to CRC Rule 2.812, *et seq.* Attorneys who have been a member of the State Bar of California for 10 years are eligible to apply as a temporary judge. The Court is the program sponsor and is approved as a provider of Minimum Continuing Legal Education credit by the State Bar of California (Provider No. 14423). Participants will receive 3 hours of in-person Bench Conduct and Demeanor training.
