14 Exercising the authority granted by Governor Gavin Newsom’s Executive Order
15 N-38-20, and the March 30, 2020 Statewide Emergency Order of Chief Justice Tani
16 Cantil-Sakauye, Chair of the California Judicial Council, this Court **HEREBY FINDS**
17 **AND ORDERS THE FOLLOWING MEASURES:**


- 19 1. The Court extends the 10 court day period provided in Penal Code section
20 859b for the holding of a preliminary examination and the defendant’s right of release to
21 not more than 30 court days, applicable only to cases in which the statutory deadline
22 otherwise would expire from 4/4/2022 to 5/13/2022, inclusive. (Statewide Emergency
23 Order by Hon. Tani Cantil-Sakauye, March 30, 2020.)

25 It is the intent of this Order to provide the maximum length of constitutionally
26 permitted continuance days authorized by the March 30, 2020 Statewide Emergency Order
27 issued by the Hon. Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, Chief Justice of the California Supreme Court.

1 Any conflicts in the above language are to be resolved in favor of granting the lengthier of the
2 continuance options.
