Safety in one's home, relationships, and person can be viewed as a basic human rights issue, yet gender-based violence and family violence across the lifespan remain pervasive. Professor Stoever will discuss the UCI Initiative to End Family Violence's unique model that combines faculty from over 20 academic departments with community partners in research, education, and clinical interventions in abuse. She will highlight innovative research particularly helpful to attorneys in domestic violence cases and will share legal best practices, seeking to achieve the vision of all people being safe in their homes, relationships, and the world.

Jane Stoever is a Professor at UC Irvine School of Law, where she directs the UCI Initiative to End Family Violence and the Domestic Violence Clinic and teaches Family Law and Legal Ethics. She also co-chairs the Orange County Domestic Violence Death Review Team. Her research concerns legal and societal responses to domestic violence, firearm fatalities, and technology-enabled abuse, and her publications include the book, The Politicization of Safety.
